Which Ego-personality Blames the Victim? The ego-personality: I only believe what I want to believe—does not listen—refuses to face reality

This ego-personality is like a person who would say "I don't believe what I see; I don't believe what I hear." He cannot believe the truth even when he sees or hears it. This person has his head in the sand and makes excuses for the perpetrator; he then tells why the injury to the victim was not that bad—and if brought to light would hurt the perpetrator, so be quiet and don't tell. He or she totally ignores any facts.

No attention is paid to the victim, the injured party, the innocent one.

Are you that one who defends the wrong instead of standing up for the right? And what is right? I am ahead of you here! If you have to ask that question chances are that you have the ego-personality: I only believe what I want to believe.

No one has to be taught what is right and what is wrong. The soul knows it when it is born.

- 1. Anything you say or do to injure the body, the property or the feelings of someone else is wrong.
- 2. Lying is wrong.
- 3. Cheating is wrong.
- 4. Stealing is wrong.

I know where the ego might go with this; I am ahead of you. So the ego-personality says:

- 1. If the victim tells the truth it will hurt the feelings of the perpetrator!
- 2. Maybe he (the perpetrator) did not mean to say or do what he did; it was an accident or the victim caused him or her to do or say it. Maybe he had a reason for stealing. Maybe, maybe, maybe...excuses, excuses
- 3. This ego-personality plays the devils advocate! Others have done the same thing. You have done it. Everyone cheats.

Anyone who knows right from wrong knows that <u>it is wrong if he does it</u>; and <u>it is</u> wrong if someone else does it.

You see, this ego-personality shows favoritism, he picks and chooses; he has a favorite side; his side is always right and the other side is always wrong. Now that right from wrong is different from what I have just described to you.

The ego-personality: I only believe what I want to believe, will make it right to steal and lie and cheat if that is his or her family member, political party, group of friends; but if the other side steals, lies or cheats that is wrong.

• I repeat myself here: Anyone who knows right from wrong knows that it is wrong if he does it; and it is wrong if someone else does it. Knowing Right from Wrong is not making wrong into right.

If you expect to be defended by this man or woman; husband or wife, lawyer, teacher or friend you will need to look elsewhere for defense; this ego-personality does not allow the soul within him or her to defend you.

This ego-personality is serpentine: subtle; cunning; it zig-zags—sinuously winding its excuses around whatever event to make wrong into right; it is constantly making excuses for the wrong behavior and with every new piece of damaging evidence against his side he comes forth with other excuses.
